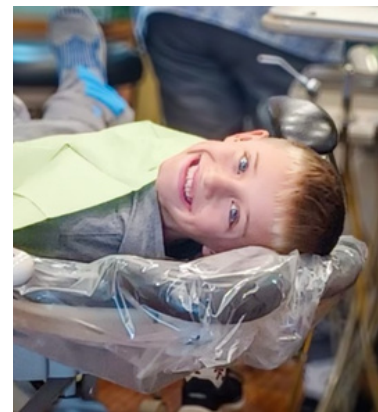


Impact Report

Who We Serve

Bethany and Bridgeview serve Scott, Cedar, Clinton, Jackson, and Muscatine Counties in Iowa and Rock Island, Henry, Mercer, Whiteside, Lee, Carroll, Warren, Henderson, Fulton, and Knox Counties in Illinois.



Foster Care

48%

of children in the **Foster Care Program** were placed in safe, loving, permanent homes. Permanency is achieved through returning home, guardianship, or adoption.

It is required by the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services to meet at least 40% permanency.



Child and Family Services

97%

of families in Bethany's **Wraparound Program** were successfully reunified and stabilized. **148** families made a customized plan to provide for their safety, social, emotional, educational, and cultural needs.

80%

of youth in the **Wraparound Program** remained in their home or placement throughout the year.



96%

of families with an allegation of child abuse or neglect learned parenting skills and received mental health and substance abuse treatment, domestic violence counseling, housing, food assistance, and more through the **Intact Family Services Program**. **90%** of these parents kept their families together.



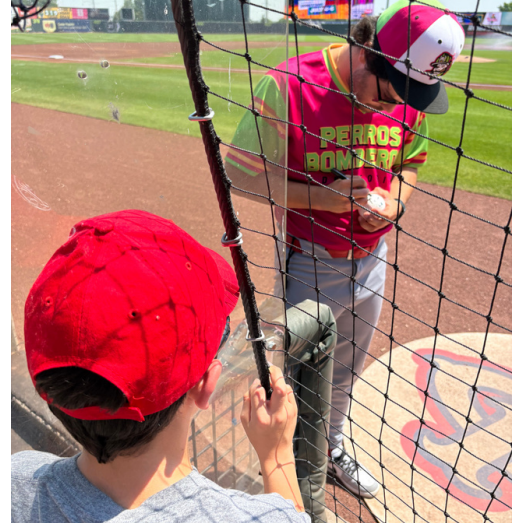
77 children were served in the **Phoenix Day Treatment Program** during the 2024-2025 academic school year. Students learned social and emotional skills, anger management skills, self-esteem skills, interpersonal skills, and Zones of Regulation.

90% of the students demonstrated an increase in learned, socially acceptable behaviors, and had a reduction in the occurrences of unusual or disruptive incidents. **98%** of the students remained in their home school.

56 students and families attended Family Nights at the beginning of the 2025-2026 academic school year. They enjoyed dinner, played games as a family, and learned about social and emotional tools that they can use at home.



48 youth participated in the **Therapeutic Recreation Program**, an after-school program that helps boys and girls with emotional and behavioral problems. **97%** of the clients demonstrated improved aggression replacement skills.



100% of the children demonstrated improved academic performance by passing to the next grade level. **95%** of the clients demonstrated improved social skills and conflict resolution skills.

Community Services

50 parents received free, evidence-based parenting education in the **Nurturing Parenting Program**. **39** families graduated from the program. Over **650** hours of one-on-one training in breaking generational cycles of abuse was provided to enrolled families.

30 individuals were off the streets with the assistance of the **Housing Families and Housing Youth programs**. The programs served **8 adults, 5 youth, and 17 children**.



1,500

students in Scott County, Iowa participated in **Teen Pregnancy Prevention** programs during the 2024-2025 school year. Students learned about sexually transmitted diseases, unhealthy relationships, negative body image, and dating violence.



1,992

students received dental exams and cleanings on the **Give Kids a Smile mobile dental clinic** during the 2024-2025 school year. The dental clinic traveled to **65 schools**.

804

gifts were given to children and families through the **Angel Tree Program**. There were **412** unduplicated families served. **93** Thanksgiving food baskets were distributed to families.



Mental Health Services

588

students in Scott County received **School-Based Mental Health Therapy**.



3,441

patients received **Psychiatric Services**, Mental Health Therapy, Peer Support Services, Intensive Psychiatric Rehabilitation, Community Support Services, or Behavioral Health Intervention Services at **Bridgeview CMHC**.

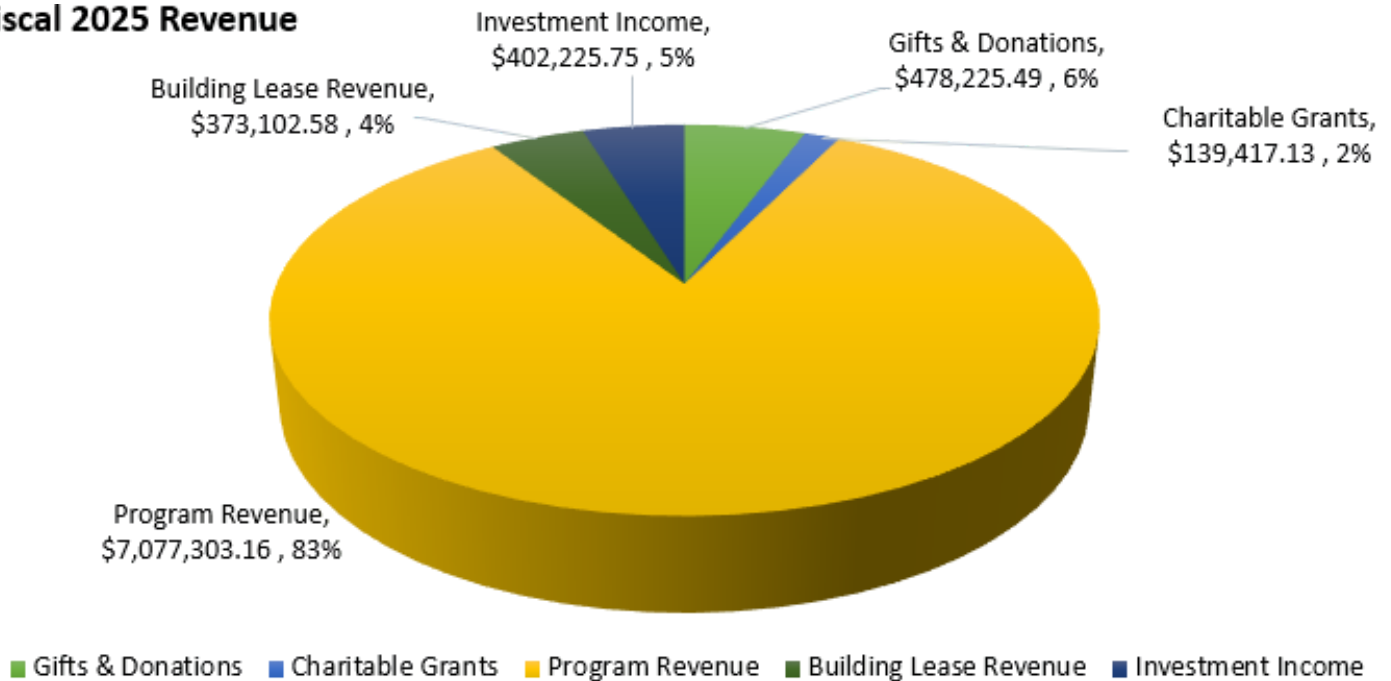
90%

of clients participating in therapy services have achieved some improvement with **at least one** of their treatment goals.

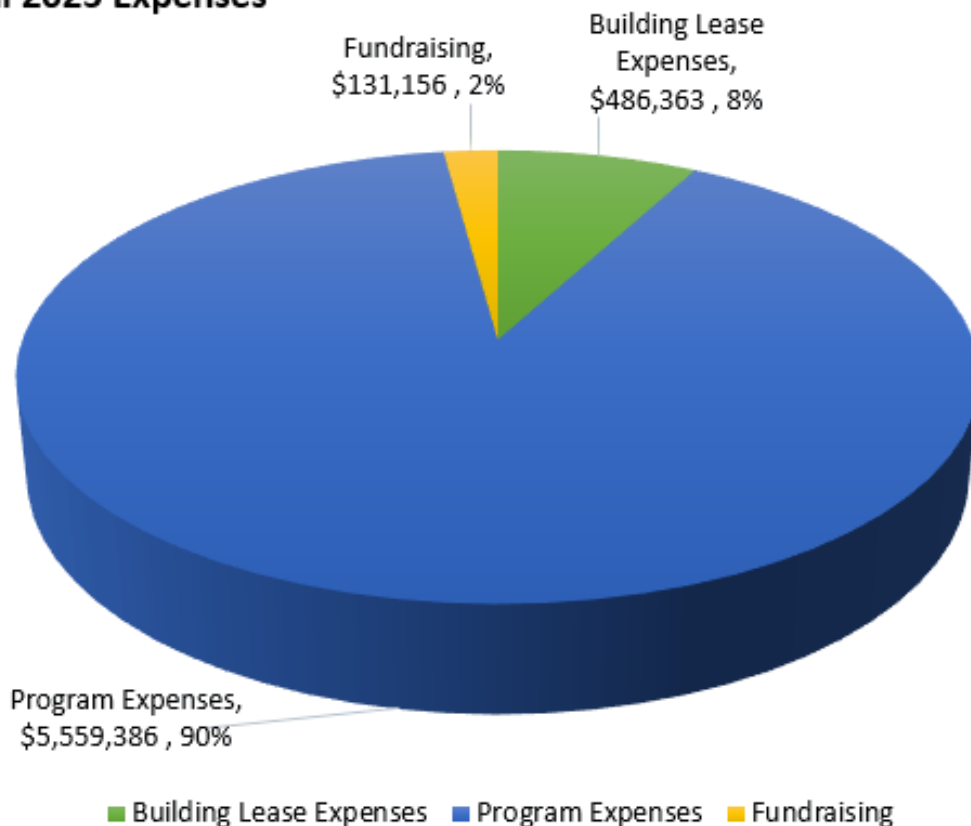


Bethany Financials

Revenue total: \$8,470,273.82

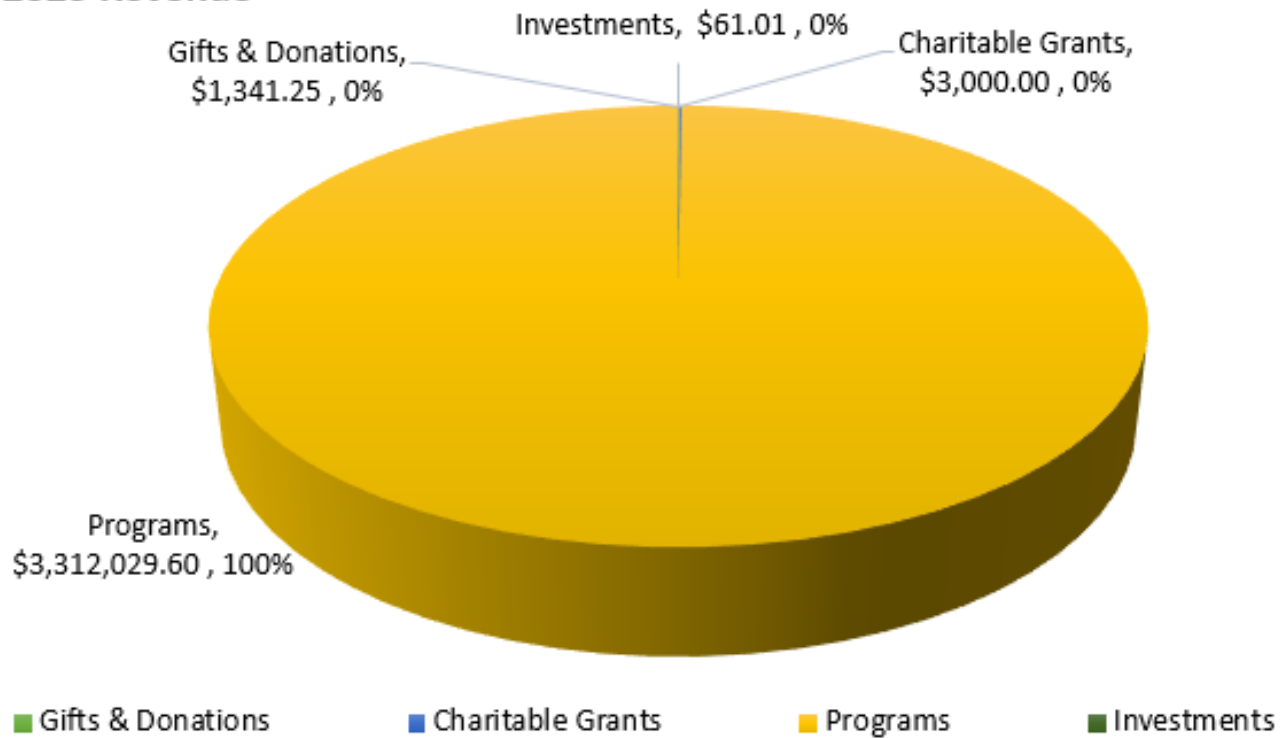
Expenses total: \$6,176,905

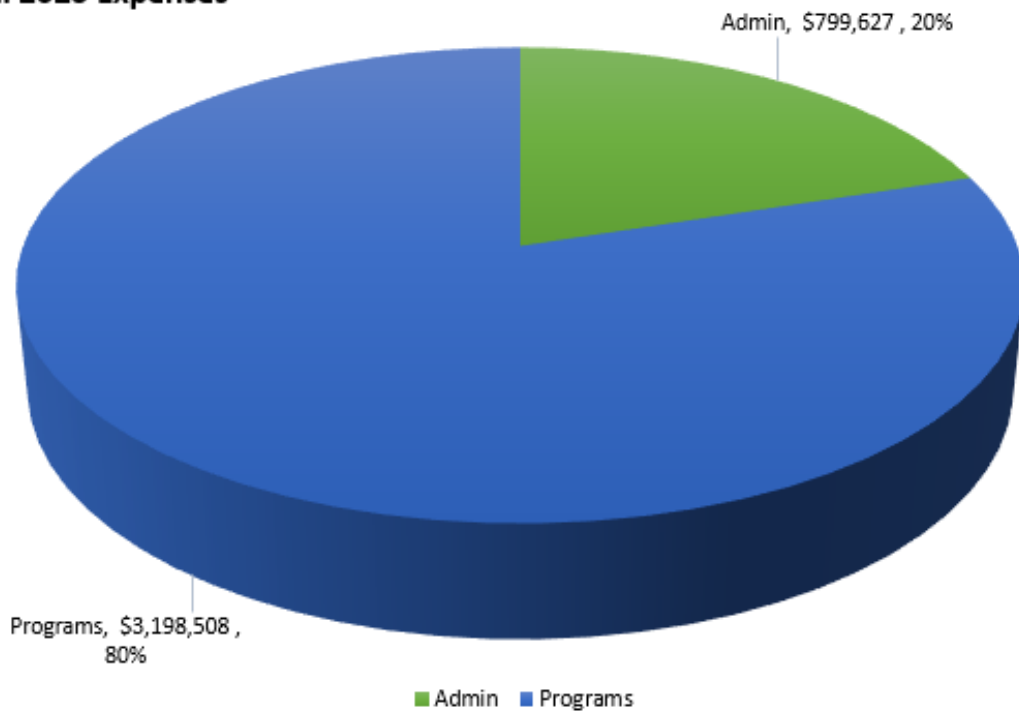
